



Children's Treatment Network of Simcoe York

Children's Treatment Network was created by families and the children's service communities in Simcoe and York to bring more rehabilitation services closer to home and provide coordinated care for children and youth with multiple special needs.

Network Partners from healthcare, education, recreation, social and community service organizations have joined together to build a new system for delivering comprehensive coordinated care. The Network has three key goals:

- Provide parents and professionals with a single point of access to all the services available across the Network
- Link service providers from many agencies together so they can take a single plan of care team approach to each child's care – at home, in school and throughout the community
- Expand the services and supports already being provided by Network Partners and fill service gaps

Since the Network's launch in 2006, there has been great progress made towards all three goals.

Our Kids

- Children and youth with multiple special needs residing in Simcoe County or York Region:
 - With long-term special needs that require treatment and support from multiple service providers
 - Age birth to 19, or up to age 21 if attending school

Many of these children are receiving support from a number of Network Partners and will benefit from using the Network's processes and tools that help provide coordinated, comprehensive care.

Children who have complex physical, developmental and/or communication needs may require additional and specialized rehabilitation services that are funded by Children's Treatment Network and provided by Network Partners.

Access to Services & Supports

Parents and professionals can connect with all the services and supports available across the Network by calling Network ACCESS toll free at 1-866-377-0286.

Network Service Navigators at ACCESS discuss the child and family's needs and assist each family to connect with the appropriate services and supports available. ACCESS also lays the groundwork for coordinated care planning. An electronic record is opened with parental consent so that all professionals supporting the child have the ability to continuously share relevant information about the child's treatment and care.

Comprehensive, Coordinated Care

It's all about bringing the right team together and focusing on the needs of the child and family to build a single plan of care. Services are provided by front line staff from Network Partner organizations who work in geographic local teams, so families can be supported closer to home.

These professionals and the family work together, in Child & Family teams, to set goals based on the family's vision and develop an integrated plan. Plans are revised and Child & Family team members will change as the child's and family's needs evolve.

New single plan of care processes and tools, including a shared electronic record and common assessments, allow professionals from across multiple sectors to share clinical information, coordinate services and work together to monitor a child's progress through all the stages of their development.

Gradual Transition to Single Plan of Care

Network Partner agencies in Simcoe and York are working together to integrate the single plan of care approach within their organizations for children with multiple special needs.

Network Partners continue to gradually transition groups of children with multiple special needs to a single plan of care. This gradual change in approach will ensure effective development of comprehensive, coordinated care for each child.

Children's Treatment Network of Simcoe York is a unique not-for-profit service delivery model for children and teens with multiple special needs who live in Simcoe County and York Region. The Network builds on the strengths of existing service providers and links healthcare, education, recreation, social and community service resources to create an integrated service system that provides families with a single point of contact for a single plan of care.
